The detailed regulations and curriculum are provided to all members. After detailed deliberations, the council resolved the following;

Chairman presented the major highlights of B.Tech Curriculum 2023 in the meeting.

The members Shri.P.H.Kurian, Prof.KasturiRengan, Shri.Chandra Koduru, Dr.Salim A, Dr.Hari V S and Shri.Anwar Musaliar commented that the presented curriculum envisages a broader perspective in terms of its depth, industry involvement and internships and suggested some small corrections for incorporating while detailing with the actual courses. Dr.Sameer S M, while accepting the broader outlook of the presented framework, has expressed major concerns in the feasibility of implementation, since it reflects major changes from the running curriculum and proposes more number of categories with different marks distributions and evaluation patterns, that the system may not afford. However, the chairman expressed full confidence in the capacity of the college to deliver the changes proposed, and the council agreed and resolved to proceed with the submitted draft framework curriculum 2023

Following Changes are recommended in B-Tech Regulations 2023, by the members

- 23R1.7 B. Tech (Minor) to be changed to B. Tech with Minor Specialization
- 23R3.7.9-II, The first sentence to be rewritten as "The students can opt internship during eighth semester,......" Instead of "The students can opt internship during eight semesters,....."
- 23R3.7.9-IV, "Internal internship supervisor shall be a member of project evaluation committee along with other project evaluation committee members, It is desirable that external supervisor from industry also shall be a member of evaluation committee.", Instead of
 - "Internal supervisor and external supervisor from industry must be a part of the interim and final presentation......"
- Clause number to be checked and error to be corrected and to ensure no duplication in clause number exists.

- 23R3.12 "The Curriculum shall include multiple course baskets for Honor/Minor and multiple course list for PEC/OEC under each department. The department shall have the right to decide the course basket/course from the list to be floated......", instead of
 - "The Curriculum shall include multiple Honor programs/Minor programs/PEC/OEC under each department. The departments have the right to decide the programs to be floated......"
- 23R4.1 & 23R4.3 The word "academic section" to be replace with "Institution"
- 23R6.1 "There shall be one senior faculty advisor (SFA) for a batch in the department and a faculty advisor (FA) each for 25 to 35 students. The Principal shall assign a regular faculty member with minimum of five year of experience as the SFA as recommended by HoD" instead of
- "There shall be one senior faculty advisor (SFA) for a batch in the department and a faculty advisor (FA) each for 25 to 35 students. The Principal shall assign a regular faculty member with minimum of five year of experience as the SFA as recommended by HoD" instead of "There shall be one senior faculty advisor (SFA) for a class and a faculty advisor (FA) each for 25 to 35 students in the class. The Principal shall assign a regular faculty member with minimum of five year of experience as the SFA in discussion with the Head of Department concerned"
- 23R8.2.1 delete Viva/week mentioned as part of class work marks
- **23R8.2.1** Course 2-0-2-2 Mark distribution to be modified by reducing the internal assessment component of theory part.
- 23R8.2.3 Mini Project/ Research based mini project- "external expert" to be removed

Regulations and curriculum 2022 of M.Tech., M.Plan., and PhD adopted from APJAKTU for the 2022 admission batch are newly introduced by the university, and the present batch of students is the first batch of the 2022 PG curriculum in among all institutions affiliated to APJAKTU.

After deliberations about the proposal, the council resolved to continue with M.Tech., MPlan and PhD Regulations and Curriculum 2022 for coming batches

be noted that most of the companies coming for campus placement permit the students to attend their exam/interview if the student has no pending arrears up to the fifth/sixth semester. In this context, it seems better to consider scheduling a supplementary examination for I and III semester courses in the vacation time of the IV semester (i.e., May/ June 2024). The V semester supplementary examinations along with the VI semester (i.e., May/ June 2025) in addition to the provisions of R6.2 of academic regulation 2022.

However, the Controller of Examination exercises his/her discretion in unavoidable circumstances so as to allow internal faculty to scrutinize question papers of his/her course.
